### **PHMDC Order #9 Explanation**

A number of questions in regards to the new order form Public Health of Madison and Dane County have been asked. The hope is to answer these questions in the following explanation. If you have further questions, please reach out to Mr. Rank.

The new metrics that are being followed to determine when kids can be in school follows a daily average of cases over a fourteen day period. The level must be at or below the metric for four consecutive weeks in order to proceed.

The metrics are as follows:

Grades K-2: 54 cases per day in Dane County

Grades 3-5: 39 cases per day in Dane County

Grades 6-12: 19 cases per day in Dane County

This past Thursday the average per day was at 45. It has been at or below this number for four weeks which is why K-2 can attend in-person. PHMDC is monitoring this number daily. As soon as it is at 39 or less for four consecutive weeks grades 3-5 will be permitted to come back in person. The same would hold true for the grades 6-12 number.
